Ramblings for Reflection:

Purpose - growth - bearing fruit: We all need a purpose in life. It motivates, challenges, sometimes disappoints, at other times it brings Joy, and, however far along we are, we know there is always more, much, much more. Growth is more about maturity: a maturity that provides us with the ability to make good, selfless, wise choices. The fruit is never for ourselves but for others, because only then is it of real value. Once again the readings remind us that God is an integral and necessary part of this whole process whether we are aware of it or not. St Paul must have written his letter in his later years as his body was declining; when he knew he could do more in a younger, fitter body than he could with aging limbs that creaked and groaned at every step. What is not written is that in slowing down and being hindered in old age allows time for greater reflection, helping us see more clearly how God is working in our lives as well as in the lives of those we encounter each day. This is the time to appreciate more fully the beauty of God's presence in creation both in the bright rebirth of spring and in the graceful falling asleep of autumn. The bright spring sun calls forth new life while the balmy autumn evenings sooth and calm. In this we are not only touched by the presence of God but we begin to feel that presence in everything and everyone we touch.
