Ramblings for Reflection: The Gospel calls individual Christians to live lives of honesty, integrity and concern for the common good... to create circles of integrity..., networks of solidarity which can expand to embrace and transform society by their prophetic witness. . . Francis). If integrity is as important as Pope Francis says, why it is not one of the gifts of the Spirit? The Church believes that Adam (and Eve) were created with the gift of Integrity but, at the Fall, the gift was corrupted along with many other gifts, including immortality and infused knowledge. Having been corrupted by Original Sin, like Adam and Eve after their expulsion from the garden, we have to work to restore them. Fortunately, Jesus has made this possible giving us the gifts of the Spirit to help achieve this. Leo Thomas wrote: Integrity happens when you do the right thing, when you make the right choices. Integrity speaks plainly. Integrity is seen when you do what you say and say what you mean and helps you keep doing the best you can. If you do your very best every day, you will discover that you have become a person of integrity. Don Pettinelli adds: Integrity gives us the courage to admit when we are wrong and choose to do what is right. It inspires us to be humble and treat others with respect no matter who they are. It is learned over time and becomes embedded in our hearts. It encourages us to focus on what we can give to the world with truthfulness and faith in God.
