Ramblings for Reflection:

Simplicity and gratitude are keys that allow Wisdom to enter our lives, a wisdom that brings with it understanding. All the great saints of the Church possess a certain aura, a presence that draws people towards them. In a Religious Congregation, like the Assumptionists, we speak of our Charism. A Charism is built around a founder, who, for Assumptionists, is Emmanuel d'Alzon. We want to be like him because we understand how much he inspired others to live the Gospel and, like him, live the will of God with love. And, reflecting more deeply, we realise that the true strength of any charism is that it leads us into direct contact with Christ. Whichever way we look at our founder (or our saint), we see the face of Christ shining through, which in turn reveals their wisdom and understanding. Assumptionists seek to live their charism not just to be like their founder but so that they, too, might reflect the face of Christ. Prof Richard Wiseman, (University of Hertfordshire) believes that pets and their owners grow more like each other because of the time they spend in each other's company. Assumptionists read the stories and writings of their founder and, in so doing, are inspired and motivated by him. The same with Jesus. We read, we reflect, we live in the way of Jesus to be inspired and motivated by him. Isn't this the same as eating and drinking the flesh and blood of Jesus so as to become more like him? **ተ**ተተተተተተተ

Thanks to all who helped with the dismantling of

The next stages of the project are as follows; moving the

children's library to the alcove where the golden statue of Our Lady currently resides (in anticipation of its eventual move into the new side chapel), moving Our Lady to the Altar of Remembrance, moving the Madonna and Child picture from there to the rear wall (facing the Sanctuary) and moving the Adult library into the alcove vacated by the children's library.


6th OCTOBER Now the summer is well under way we are beginning to collect goods for the wide

The upcoming **World Meeting of Families** in Dublin this August – 21st to 26th, has invited Fr. James Martin, SJ, to present "Welcoming LGBT People in Parishes".

Fr. Martin, authored the book 'Building a Bridge".

"The message to LGBT Catholics seems straightforward: you're an important part of the church. . .I'm tremendously grateful for this invitation, for what it says to LGBT Catholics, a group of people who have for so long felt excluded. . .I hope they see this invitation, which had to be approved by the Vatican, as an unmistakable sign of welcome from the Church." Father James Martin SJ

Fr. Martin explained the invitation was jointly offered by the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life at the Vatican and the Archdiocese of Dublin, who are organising the Meeting. He will be presenting "best practices" for parishes on how to show welcome to LGBT Catholics and their families. With more than 30,000 people registered for the event, this is a great opportunity for Fr. Martin and LGBT people to help show the goodness and holiness of their families. The website shows that he is speaking in the afternoon of Thursday 23 August.
