Ramblings for Reflection: If you were able to reflect on the readings this past week, one of the main questions has been whether we choose God or not. In the past few weeks, this choice has been tested, because it seems that Jesus asks us to do the impossible: to eat his flesh and drink his blood. This week, we see that it was impossible for some of Jesus' followers. So, let us ask the question in a different way: "Do you choose to love others or not?" Of course, we would choose to love, even though it is difficult to love all others in the same way; some even seem impossible to love. If we choose to love, then we choose God, because God is love and the source and origin of all love. But, to love is not just a feeling or a desire, it is something that is lived daily at every moment, sometimes perfectly, sometimes dismally, but it is lived. In loving, we want the very best for those we love and will do anything, whatever the cost, to show this. Thus, we reflect God's love for us, for God, too, wants the very best for us. Just as God's love for us was incarnated in Jesus Christ, our love is incarnated in every loving action. And, just as God is eternal so, too, is love and any truly loving relationship is eternal. No wonder that marriage is the very best example of this - a relationship of flesh and blood!
