Ramblings for Reflection How many of you have hearing aids? Are they not signs of the importance our hearing is to us? One of the great things they do is filter out all the extraneous noise and help focus on what is being said. This is what Jesus always wants to do for us. Hearing what is said provides us with a link to everybody else, helps us feel that we belong, that we are in the know. So, it is important that the word proclaimed in Church is articulate, clear and understandable, not rushed or mumbled, and free of mistakes. Only then can we really be open to the message the words convey. Wherever you go, in whatever group belongs or company one works for, communication is of top priority and yet it is often the cause behind many a mishap or failure because it has been misunderstood. Hearing, then, is not enough; it must be accompanied by right understanding. How often is an innocent phrase misunderstood and causes hurt and ill feeling? This week, Jesus not only cures the deaf man, but the deaf man is able to speak clearly - I believe the man would have expressed his joy, happiness and gratitude for the gift he had been given. Does this not mean that, if we truly hear the word that is spoken to us each week, we, too, will want to speak about the message we have received, to share that message with others - a message we happiness would convey with joy, thanksgiving! ****
