Alleluia!

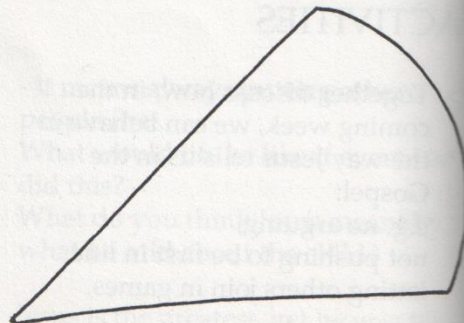
A reading from the Good News given to us by Mark.

SHARING

What do kites, windmills and yachts all have in common?
