## Ramblings for Reflection:

For the first thousand years, St Augustine of Hippo inspired the spiritual thinking of the Church. He showed us how much God loved us, the importance of gratitude to God, and wrote about the care, protection and help that God offers us throughout our lives. Then came 'The imitation of Christ', which spoke about our unworthiness, insignificance, and sinfulness that sowed the fear of going to Hell. This was not wrong but too lopsided. It promoted an introspection and emphasis on becoming perfect before attempting to reach out and help others. It also encouraged the view that any form of joy or happiness was sinful – a forerunner of Puritanism. Fortunately, Pope Francis has reminded us of the importance of the JOY of the gospel and encourages us to reflect that JOY - a JOY (and LOVE of God) evident in St Augustine's writings. Because servants have not always been treated well, often as subservient, we have a difficulty with the idea of service, despite the effort Jesus made to show us its importance, value and richness. In fact, the call to service is something to be envied, not avoided. It is one of God's great gifts. It is a gift present in so many of our Saints e.g. Damien of Molokai, Jeanne Jugan (Little Sisters of the Poor) and St Teresa of Calcutta who said "The poverty of being unwanted, unloved, and uncared for is the greatest poverty." She showed us that service is the best way of expressing our LOVE when done with JOY! "Faith in action is love. And love in action is service." This gift of SERVICE is offered to us.
