Ramblings for Reflection: There was once a man who lived by himself who was completely blind. Yet, he carried a lighted lamp with him whenever he went out at night. One night on his way home, after having dinner out, he came across a group of people. They saw that he was blind, yet he was carrying a lighted lamp. They started passing comments and making fun of him. One said to him, "Hey Man! You are blind and can't see anything! Why do you carry the lamp then?" The blind man replied. "Yes. unfortunately, I am blind and I can't see anything but the lighted lamp which I am carrying is for people like you who can see. You may not see a blind man coming and you might end up pushing me over. That is why I carry a lighted lamp!" It is only when we meet blind people and encounter some of the difficulties they face that we truly thank God for our sight and what it allows us to do. Our story above introduces the idea that our sight is something we should be using for others, those in need of care, the lonely. marginalised, the sick etc. The gospel also suggests that the kind of sight that Jesus offers us enables us to see the things that are hidden: the inner struggles and challenges that people face. The sight Jesus offers prompts and motivates us to actively seek to remedy the need we see just as Jesus did.
