Ramblings for Reflection: "The ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners. and raised up above the heavens . . . " When we read words like this about Jesus, it seems to put him way beyond our reach. In fact, he appears to be so otherworldly that it seems impossible even to attempt to try to walk in his footsteps. I believe the writer of Hebrews wants to make it clear to us that Jesus has not only saved us but continues to watch over us. And, not only does he save us from the many pitfalls we encounter in life but, even when we fall foul of them, Jesus is there, ready to pick us up again and plonk us back on the right road. To be holy, uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sin, to be heavenly means that if you bumped into Jesus you would automatically feel perfectly comfortable in his presence, at home with him, like a lifelong friend. In his presence, everything would seem right and in harmony. Whatever stresses and strains you had been going through would diminish almost to insignificance. You would experience an inner joy that could only be explained by the presence of great love. You would feel valued and affirmed and even believe that with him everything is possible (because it is!) He would evoke within you those great gifts of reverence and respect, wonder and awe, not just for Jesus but, more importantly, for yourself for being in his company. , ነታተተተተተተ
