Parish Prayer Bless this parish, Lord. Let our community reflect your own communion of love. Help us to live peacefully and humbly, attending to the call of your Spirit and mindful of our duty to everything you have created. Strengthen the bonds of our families and friendships with patience and kindness. Make us joyful messengers of your kingdom and a source of comfort for those in need.

Ramblings for Reflection: Awareness is always important and today we see how Jesus was aware of what was going on. His focus was not on himself but on the people around him, in particular, the widow. To emphasise his point, he contrasts her, someone who happened to be very poor, with the self-proclaimed, rather pompous, wealthy Scribes who happened to be rich. However, the story is not about wealth or position but about generosity of spirit. Jesus could identify with the total self-giving of the widow since he was on the same path – an appropriate theme on this **Remembrance Sunday**. After the Second World War, walking down the streets of East London, one of its poorest areas, you would find people's front doors always open. You could pop in to any house and ask for a cup of sugar or flour when you ran short (and receive a cup of tea!); a favour to be returned once you had restocked. In those days, children could sleep up to 7 in a room and not feel hard done by. Life was extremely hard. But, there was an inner joy, a happiness and an energy that made it a great place to be because everyone cared for everyone! One East Ender said that during the war, on the way home to lunch from the pub, they would invite any passing stranger or visitor to join them, without telling mum!! In this kind of generosity, 'I' am not the centre of the world, God is! And where do we find God? in the stranger, the visitor, and the neighbour who wants a cup of sugar.
