Ramblings for Reflection: inquisitiveness of man desires to know what the result will be before it happens, using the most ingenious ways to find out. The success of the lottery depends on this! This inquisitiveness works overtime to know what is going to happen at the end of time. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us not to worry about the end time; everything will be OK. He will make sure of that because we are people of faith. The faith Jesus refers to, however, is not just a set of beliefs, it is a trust in God that will see us through the unknown and uncertain. A faith that will take risks, leading us to places others fear to tread. It is stronger than any doubt or fear. A faith not preoccupied with the catastrophes Jesus alludes to but concerned with others and wants to help them through whatever the end time may bring so that we might all arrive at the end together. There is a theory that, when we die, we will actually find ourselves back in the place we have just left. But, having become like Jesus, we will see it in a wholly new way and experience all the riches of which we were previously unaware and see all the truths that we had never grasped before. The joy and experience of this discovery will lead us to give spontaneous praise and glory to God. Why? Because for the first time we will experience pure love: God.

Christmas can be a difficult time for children with a parent in prison. At a time of family togetherness, this holiday is often a painful and lonely reminder of separation.

Through the generosity of parishioners last year we were able to make sure over 350 children were remembered with their own special Christmas gift.

Help us spread a little Christmas cheer by donating a gift, so together, we can reach even more children affected by imprisonment this Christmas.

How to donate a new Christmas gift for a prisoner's child

- · Contact your parish's point of contact
- Buy a present for your allocated child, we suggest under £15
- Return your gift to your local drop off point *PLEASE DO NOT WRAP PRESENTS*
- · Pact will collect and distribute to children in need of a gift.
- Gifts will be delivered through special Christmas family days in prisons, youth sessions, support groups and a small number will be sent through the post

Gifts will need to go through prison security, but will be wrapped by prisoners and volunteers before being given to children.
