The Magi were looking for the one who they believed would be the true hope of the world but they also wanted to pay him tribute - a sign of their gratitude for all that they had received in life thanksgiving that they were given the opportunity to see him - thanksgiving for his presence. Whatever our search, whether for abilities or virtues or anything else, do we reflect on what we want to offer Jesus in thanksgiving? When I was small, I would receive one big gift at Christmas each year. One year it was a scooter, another time a pair of metal roller skates.
