### **Ramblings for Reflection**

In reflection, the life of Jesus comes to us in snapshots: his Birth, a Holy Family, a visit of the Magi and now his Baptism. Whenever I ask people at a baptism why they want their child baptised, they invariably say that they want their child to become a full member of the family of the Church. Maybe that is what Jesus was doing at his Baptism, showing us that he belonged to the family of humankind – that he was fully one of us. What the Father said to Jesus he said to us in our baptism, "You are my beloved child, with whom I am well pleased" and we too received the Spirit of God. Not only does Jesus become one of us, he enters fully into our lives. We are integrally united. The Star, the light that led the Magi to Jesus, is given to us in the form of a candle, not just a symbol of faith but the actual Light of Jesus now shines in us and will continue to do so for the rest of our lives. Our choice, like that of Jesus, is whether we let others see or experience this light, or hide it under a tub? Mary and Joseph were Jesus' family but so too were the Father and the Holy Spirit and later his chosen disciples and his followers. Never make the faith journey alone, your church family is all around you to help, support, sustain, motivate, encourage, guide and love you all the way; just as you are for them!
