### Ramblings for Reflection

After hearing the story of the Wedding Feast of Cana, water appears to be more than what it seems, hiding something special. And what is hidden is so much richer – at least wine drinkers think so!! If this is true for water, what does it say about people? Everyone hides within them an inner richness, beauty and goodness, which reflects something of the image of God. Jesus came to live among us in order to help, enable and open us to discover our hidden gifts. Gifts that act both as a light and as a mirror that in helping others we discover our own inner beauty and light. St Paul helps us understand this when he writes that we are all made and filled with the same Spirit - the Spirit that descended on Jesus in his baptism. Yet, our uniqueness only reveals itself when we share our gifts with the community. It is a uniqueness that, when freely and generously offered to others, increases in power. The psalmist would say that this power sings of the glory and praise of God. Listen to Pope Francis: "I have a dogmatic certainty: God is in every person's life. Even if the life of a person has been a disaster, even if it is destroyed by vices, drugs or anything else - God is in this person's life. You can - you must - try to seek God in every human life." - especially your own. **ተ**ተተተተተተ
