Ramblings for Reflection

Called to service by the Lord, both Isaiah and Peter recognise their complete unworthiness for the task in hand, yet their response is total and so is their trust. Before communion, we repeat the words time after time after time: Lord, I am not worthy. Do we say these words with our heads or do we feel that way in the depth of our being. Only in feeling really unworthy will we be able to completely trust in the Lord. This kind of trust means believing that God not only died and rose again to save us from sin but that we are truly and utterly forgiven. Added to this is the fact that, because this freedom is total gift, it is impossible to pay anything back and equally impossible to show that we are worthy of the gift. This leaves us with no excuses but to live the life Jesus asks of us. Only in doing so will we discover that this is the life we have always wanted to live! Holiness doesn't mean doing extraordinary things, but doing ordinary things with love and faith. . . . We, the women and men of the Church, we are in the middle of a love story: each of us is a link in this chain of love. And, if we do not understand this, we have understood nothing of what the Church is. . . . Faith is not a light that scatters all our darkness but a lamp that guides our steps in the night and suffices for the journey. **Pope Francis. ተተተተተተተ**

CAFOD are inviting everyone to pray for the people of Yemen and the desperate situation in that country. In a message asking for prayers, Chris Bain writes: 'As you may have seen in the news, the suffering in Yemen is one of the gravest humanitarian crises in the world today. After nearly four years of war, more than 14 million people are facing starvation and 85,000 children may have already died from extreme

There is some hope in Yemen, with a ceasefire brokered in December, promising to restore the Hodeida port and allow food and medicine into

the country. CAFOD has worked through partners in Yemen since 2016, and while we welcomed the UK government's announcement last week that it will uplift funding to the UN Peace process in Yemen by £2.5 million, we know that the situation is so desperate that more needs to be done. Thank you for your thoughts and prayers for the people suffering in Yemen. Fr Tom has asked that we use the **Prayer for Yemen** on the front of the newsletter for the next few weeks in place of the parish prayer in our intercessions
