Ramblings for Reflection | I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. (Phil 3:8) We get to know people by living and sharing life alongside them. The more time we spend together, the greater the bond and the greater the innate ability to see through their eyes, feel with their feelings, know how they would react given certain situations. This is why we make our Lenten journey with Christ, encountering Jesus in the Gospels each day. St Paul did this after his conversion and every day thereafter. The more one is aware of Christ's presence, the more it becomes essential to discover that presence in every situation and circumstance. And there's the rub! Some situations not only seem devoid of God's presence, they seem to contradict the understanding of a loving God, a God of life who wants the best for us. The most obvious is the death of someone loved dearly, especially when that person is young. Remember! Jesus felt forsaken by the Father at his death! When Jesus said he would return to take us with him he did not before we have died. Jesus does not take us when we are alive but is there to welcome us on the other side of death. This makes Holy Week so important. We have to make that journey with Jesus, experience his suffering, his anxieties, even his despair. For then we will discover that Jesus is there for us whenever we have to make that same journey, experience that same abandonment, knowing that the end result is RESURRECTION!

Mon 15 April 7.30pm - Passover Meal in the Church Hall. To celebrate Passover is to do what Jesus did with his disciples at the Last Supper. It is a chance for us

to understand our Jewish roots and our Christian Eucharist more deeply. The Passover Meal is a family occasion and children form an integral part of the proceedings, so all are very welcome.

You need to bring a number of things with you: a baked potato for each person, cooked and wrapped in foil (to keep warm), sufficient wine for 4 toasts, soft drinks/water, cutlery, plates and glasses for each person. Roast lamb is provided. (You can bring salad and toppings for the potatoes as well – to share with those around you, if you wish.)

It is a wonderful way to begin Holy Week. All ages welcome. Please sign up on the board in the porch as we need to know numbers by **8**th **April** so that we can order the meat.

Thurs 18 April 10:30 - We need help on Maundy Thursday morning after morning prayer to set up the altar of repose (move the altar from the bereavement area into the church hall and set up the plants around it to remember Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane. 19 April - Good Friday As usual we mark this sacred day with a Walk of Witness and United Service. We gather in Bancroft Gardens at 10.30 am for prayer then walk behind three crosses along Bancroft and High Street for the service, led by our ministers with songs accompanied by musicians from Zeo Church, at 11 am.

Hot cross buns will be distributed along the route and in Market Place.



This year the Hot cross buns distribution is down to our church. Trish will not be at the Walk of Witness this year as she will be performing in the Passion at Trafalgar Square (which will be

streamed live in our church at 12pm). So she needs help to organise this. She can arrange to get the hot cross buns but she needs people to help separate them and give them out along the route and in the market square. We will put them into paper towels or bags.

Therefore, we need a few people who will be willing to meet early on Good Friday morning to prepare these and then help with the distribution along the walk and in the square. Please let Trish know if you can be one of these people. She won't be able to do this without our help.
