## Ramblings for Reflection

Considering that Shepherds were included among the sinners like Tax Collectors, heralding Jesus as the Good Shepherd would have raised many eyebrows. And yet, this understanding of Jesus makes him both human and endearing and reveals his deep, deep care and concern for us. Melito of Sardis (2<sup>nd</sup>C) wrote the following about Jesus:

"I am the Christ: I have destroyed death, triumphed over the enemy, trampled hell underfoot, bound the strong one. and taken people to the heights of heaven... I am your forgiveness. I am the Passover that brings salvation. I am the lamb who was immolated for you. I am your ransom, your life, your resurrection, your light, I am your salvation and your king. I will bring you to the heights of heaven. With my own right hand I will raise you up, and I will show you the eternal Father. . . . I am the repose of the dead, the finder of the lost. the light of those in darkness, the redeemer of captives, the guide of the wandering, the refuge of those who mourn. the Shepherd of those who are saved" (Melito of Sardis 2C).

Doesn't this want to make you shout Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, the day we pray for Priests and for vocations to the Priesthood. The annual collection for the Priest Training Fund will take place this weekend. This fund pays for the priestly formation of men for the Catholic Priesthood. There are currently 45 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 27 of whom are for our own Diocese and last year eight men ordained to the Priesthood to serve as our future Priests. The fund also supports the ongoing enrichment and formation of our ordained Priests. Your generous donation helps ensure we can support these men who are called to be like Christ the Good Shepherd.

Fr Tom, Susanna and Trish attended a course last week to run a pilot of the **Reconciliation course** in our parish. It is an exciting opportunity for us to be a part of a nationwide initiative led by Archbishop Justin Welby.

Many of us long for our faith to have a positive impact in a divided and hurting world, but in the midst of this it can be difficult to know where to start. We believe that God is in the business of restorina brokenness and transforming relationships, and that we are called to take part. Archbishop Justin Welby has brought together leading thinkers and peacemaking practitioners to create a 5-session course to help you do this. Discover your calling as part of God's story by supportive community practising а approaches to engage with division, and grow in confidence in navigating the challenges of today's culture.

We found this course interesting, exciting and amazingly helpful with conflicts conflicts of our own. It is for anyone who wants to be a reconciler in their own lives, whether at home in the family, at work, inour church, in the community or maybe even wider if there is the need. We are running this programme all **Sundays evenings in June** in the parish hall. **6pm for refreshments and then 6.30-8pm for the session**. St Richard Reynolds Staff - Three Peaks Challenge. A team of 27 members of staff from St Richard Reynolds Catholic College will attempt to complete the 3 Peaks Challenge in May 2019. Staff are raising funds to complete their College sport hall and get it into use as soon as possible for their students. The National Three Peaks Challenge involves climbing the three highest peaks of Scotland, England and Wales within 24 hours. The total walking distance is 23 miles (37km) and the total ascent is 3064 metres (10,052ft) - twice the ascent of the Yorkshire Three Peaks, over a similar total walking distance.
