Ramblings for Reflection Glory, Glory, Glory to God! Glory to God in the highest! What do we mean by this? The dictionary says Glory means: High renown or honour won by notable achievement; magnificence or great beauty; worthy of praise. It refers to the splendour and bliss of heaven; praise, worship, and thanksgiving offered to God. It is seen as a ring or halo around the head of Christ or a saint. It can be an exclamation of delight. Glory is of the essence of God so we can add nothing to it. It would be better to think of the presence of God as the glory of God shining through us or someone else or creation itself. We experience the Glory of God shining through Christ in his life, death and resurrection. When we pray for God's blessing we are praying that the Glory of God shine through or in those for whom we pray. And this week we are encouraged to see this glory in terms of Love. So our praise, worship and thanksgiving becomes both a recognition and a proclamation of God's glory and of God's love as something that we experience and acknowledge. Glory lies at the heart of wonder and awe that invoke reverence and respect - leading us to experience the radiance and power of God's glory. In this way we begin to see the parallels between Glory and Love. Since God is love and those who live in love live in God, no wonder our grateful hearts give praise and glory to God! . **ት**ተተተተተተ
