Ramblings for Reflection - Jesus, the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last, prays for us continually so that we may be one. What more could we want? Jesus cannot express more fully how much he loves us. He wants to be fully part of our lives so that we are able to live through all the challenges, difficulties and traumas of life in a way that is enriching not just for us but for everyone. At his Ascension, Jesus once again confirmed that he had not left, but continues to be with us and will work his wonders today through us if we but trust and believe. Pope Francis put it this way: "Dear brothers and sisters, the Ascension does not point to Jesus' absence, but tells us that he is alive in our midst in a new way. He is no longer in a specific place in the world as he was before the Ascension. He is now in the lordship of God, present in every space and time, close to each one of us. In our life we are never alone: we have this Advocate who awaits us, who defends us. We are never alone: the Crucified and Risen Lord guides us." Pope Francis makes it clear that, now he has ascended, Jesus is present among us in many different guises, all of which enhance our experience of his presence in the world. A presence that calls us to want to give praise and thanksgiving to God in all our encounters and experiences.
