## INTRODUCTION

# GOSPEL (cf Matthew 16:13-19)

One day, Jesus asked his disciples, 'Who do people think I am?'

'Some say you are John the Baptist, others say the Prophet Elijah,' they answered. Jesus turned to his friends and said, 'Who do you think I am?'

Peter answered, 'You are the son of God!' Jesus smiled and said, 'Peter, you are a happy man, because my heavenly Father revealed this to you. You are the rock on which I will build my Church.'

### DISCUSSION

What did Peter do for a living before he became a disciple of Jesus? – He was a fisherman, who many believe lived in Capernaum by the Sea of Galilee.

Why was Peter chosen as leader of the early

Church? – Peter had been with Jesus since the very beginning of his ministry, and he had witnessed all the marvellous things that Jesus had said and done. He *knew* that Jesus was the son of God, and in this way God chose him to be the shepherd of his flock on earth.

What do we know about St Paul? – Paul was a Jewish Pharisee, and was well educated and very religious. He lived in the city of Tarsus, and never actually met Jesus. He wanted to uphold the Jewish law and traditions and so he had many of the followers of Jesus thrown into prison.

What happened to Paul to make him change? — One day, whilst on his way to a place called Damascus, to arrest some Christians, God appeared to Paul as a brilliant light and asked him to stop hurting the followers of Jesus. Paul changed his ways and instead of being one of the greatest enemies of Jesus, he became one of his greatest friends.

Did Peter and Paul know each other? – They eventually met and became good friends when they realised that they were both working for Jesus. They travelled far and wide preaching the Good News about Jesus and sharing the Christian faith with others.

Why do we have a special day when we remember Peter and Paul? – They are the greatest leaders of the early Church, and they spent their lives working endlessly for Jesus. Both of them suffered for their faith and spent time in prison, but even then they continued their work by writing many letters that we can still read today. We remember their courage and faith, and thank them for sharing Christ's message with the world.
