Ramblings for Reflection



Jesus said his body and blood is real food and real drink. This suggests that he offers us more than sustenance in the Eucharist. Jesus offers us all those other

essentials that we need for a full life. It is said that when a baby is born, if it has no human contact, no sense that it is loved and cared for, no matter how much it is fed, it will die. Like that baby we need more than food, we need to know we are loved and experience that love, that we are cared for and valued. We need to receive goodness and kindness and be trusted. Not only do we need to receive them but we also need to offer them in return. This is what Jesus means by real food. In the Eucharist, Jesus shows us that he values each of us beyond our imagining; that he loves us with a love that we will only come close to understanding in the afterlife. We are valued for our uniqueness and for what we have to contribute to the whole human family for its prosperity and wholeness. The Eucharist not only nurtures all this within us but it inspires, motivates and empowers us to want to share these gifts with others for the common good - for the greater good. Only in receiving and sharing in the Eucharist regularly will we progressively discover what Jesus means by offering us Real Food and Real Drink in his Body and Blood!

There will be a second collection next weekend for Peter's Pence. Peter's Pence is the name given to the financial support offered by the faithful to the Holy Father as a sign of their sharing in the concern of the Successor of Peter for the many different needs of the Universal Church and for the relief of those most in need.
