Ramblings

Understanding the cultural background changes the way we understand a story. The astounding element of our Martha and Mary story is the fact that Jesus was teaching Mary. This was completely uncharacteristic in his day. But Jesus was master of doing things differently, breaking with custom. In our culture, if a special visitor calls, we would want to prepare something to give them and ask another member of the family to engage in conversation while doing so - both are necessary. Putting culture and context aside, the Martha and Mary story is about prayer and action and there are times when one is better than the other. Jesus could be considered a workaholic but we also know that he spent hours in private prayer and contemplation. Some of us are better at the action and not so good at prayer and vice versa. The priority we give them can also change as we go through life. Paul spent several years in contemplation before becoming the spirited and indefatigable preacher of the Gospel. Our Founder, Emmanuel d'Alzon, was a power house in terms of apostolic work but he wrote his best spiritual works during his convalescence, because of burn-out, when he had to time to pray, reflect and contemplate. There are times when one is better than the other. This diminishes neither. Praying for the healing of creation is necessary but we also have to do something about it. Prayer leads to action our founder would say. But action requires the support and strength of our prayer.
