Ramblings

Sin, forgiveness, reconciliation, salvation offer much for reflection. However we describe sin, it is clearly something that weighs us down and entraps us, preventing us from living our lives joyfully in God's service. It separates us from God, distorts our vision of reality, of ourselves and of God. Forgiveness, reconciliation and salvation are the ways in which we are set free from all this. Although it is a freedom from, it is also a freedom for, a freedom that inspires us to good works, of seeing the goodness in the world that is hidden behind fears of all kinds. Through his stories Luke clearly shows that Jesus' great desire is to set us free and to promote within us that which endures (heavenly things); goodness, gentleness, caring, loving, generosity, self-giving, self-sacrifice, hope, joy, happiness, etc. All of which will flow naturally from us without any effort once we are set free. "Passing some elephants, a man stopped, confused. Each huge creature was held by a small rope tied to its front leg. No chains, no cages. The elephants could easily have broken away but for some reason didn't. He asked their trainer why. The trainer said, 'When they are very young and much smaller, we use the same size rope to tie them and, at that age, it's enough to hold them. As they grow up, they are conditioned to believe they cannot break away. They believe the rope can still hold them, so they never try to break free.' The man was amazed. These animals could easily break free but believing they couldn't, they were stuck right where they were." Whatever your past, Jesus has set vou free!!
