**Ramblings** The rich man (Dives) in Jesus story lacked true awareness. He must have seen Lazarus at his door whenever he passed through. Awareness, then, is not just about seeing but a way of seeing that leads to an experience. In our case, an experience of the presence of God, of the sacred. The rich man, focused only on himself, probably saw Lazarus as someone who had sinned against God and was being punished, just as he saw himself as blessed with wealth and opulence by God for being righteous. Jesus continually taught us about awareness through his parables seeking to help shape the way we perceive ourselves. others and the world. It is an awareness built on the principles of loving God and neighbour. In loving God we are reminded that we (and everyone else) are made in God's image. We come to experience the presence of God in ourselves and others and, once aware of that presence, our vision of everything changes radically, enabling us to see with God's eyes. Taken out of ourselves we are better able to see the world through the eyes of others. Our encounter with creation makes us aware of the importance of the sun and the rain in the growth of plants and flowers and of the intricate network of dependency among the insects, beetles, birds, and animals; opening us to the wonderful creativity and beauty of God. If creation offers us this, how much more must the people we encounter be treasure-houses of the splendid goodness, beauty and love of God. Don't be fooled by outward appearances, like the rich man, but become truly AWARE!! \*\*\*\*\*\*
