Ramblings

For the seeker and those open to challenge there is always something new to learn about self, about others and about God. Of all the attributes of God, Mercy must take a leading role. Yet, there is so much more to God's mercy than forgiveness, necessary and essential though that is. God's mercy is empowering. It motivates and urges us into action, particularly in giving us the desire to emulate the mercy we have received. Mercy flows freely and lovingly from God; it is never earned. We cannot even say we deserve God's mercy. We can say, however, that we need God's mercy because it has the power to free us from the weight and oppression of the past. Mercy enables us to move forward freely and with confidence, knowing that we are valued and loved not because we are perfect but because we are a child of God. God's mercy enables us to see the good in ourselves and in others knowing that this is what God sees in us. God sees the potential for good with which he has blessed us and wants to help us use this goodness generously for the benefit of others as well as ourselves. God sees how lovable we are and God's mercy enables us to see the lovableness of others while leading us to a deeper understanding of God's love for us. 
