### Ramblings

Grace (2 Thess), in all its forms, is a gift from God. It is a power source like the oil for a lamp. It provides us with courage, fervour, purpose and belief. As with all God's gifts, it is freely bestowed to help us give of our best, enabling us to live life to the full as missionaries of Good News. Since the Holy Spirit is the bearer and depositor of Grace, we speak more of the power and the working of the Holy Spirit than of grace, having moved from the gift received to the giver of the gift. However, the title Grace allows us to understand its qualities and workings better. Calling someone gracious or speaking of graciousness we are mindful of words and kindness, gentleness, qualities like pleasantness, magnanimity, courtesy, elegance, benevolence, respect, reverence, and dignity; qualities and attributes that we hope to find in others as well as ourselves. No wonder we speak of a gracious and loving God, the origin and giver of grace. The grace of God flows gently and lovingly into us every time we come into God's presence. Whenever we recognise the presence of God in someone, in a place or in creation, we come into contact with the grace of God and cannot but be touched by it in a beautiful way. Grace, then, signifies the presence of Christ in us, Christ who is our light. Let us pray with John Henry Newman: "Dear Lord... shine through me, and be so in me that every soul I come into contact with may feel Your presence in my soul... Let me thus praise You in the way You love best, by shining on those around me." **^^^^^**


