Maybe both! Each year, towards the end of a Gospel, we are presented with the challenges we will have to face in one form or another. These challenges were given just before Jesus was led to his death. In helping us maybe he was also helping himself, offering himself encouragement. He assures us that whenever we face great challenges that test our faith, our commitment and our loyalty, that he will be there by our side. These are not just words of advice for us but also for himself. When he felt most abandoned, he cried out, "My God, My God, why have you deserted me?" The cry was heard and his dying words were "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." After his ascension, many of his followers faced the struggles he had foretold. They must have found strength and courage in Jesus words. We can be sure that if ever we need him, Jesus will not forsake us even in our darkest hour. Let us pray with John Henry Newman: Lead, kindly Light, amid th'encircling gloom, lead Thou me on! The night is dark, and I am far from home; lead Thou me on! . . . So long your power has blest me, sure it still will lead me on. . . Meantime, along the narrow-rugged path, that you have trod, lead, Saviour, lead me home in childlike faith, home to my God.
