



The call to be ready and alert is repeated today, this time, however, we await the birth of Jesus coming to join us anew; to renew his presence in and among us. In persecution, faith is challenged continually. The value of prayer and community become a priority and the importance of Jesus to us clarified daily. Every moment of every day carries a sense of significance and urgency. Advent is a special opportunity to clothe everything we say and do with an awareness or recognition of God's presence. The wisdom of birth is that out of great suffering comes new life, great joy and happiness, the result of nine months preparation. We only have three weeks to prepare, but the greater the preparation the greater the joy. Christmas giftgiving makes everyone more pleasant, open and generous. God gives us the best of himself in Jesus, being always open and generous to us. This Advent recognise God's presence in every act of kindness, love, generosity and goodness so as to experience the true Christian joy of Jesus birth.

I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (January 26th) is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God. This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity.

May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old: "This word is very near to you: it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance" (Dt 30:14).
