**Ramblings** Why are people wary of Obedience? Is it because they fear failure? Afraid too much will be asked of them? Or do they perceive it as giving up freedom? Religious will tell you that they take vows of poverty, chastity and obedience "In order to be free!" Paul asks for the obedience of faith and Joseph, the husband of Mary, shows this obedience concretely. The challenges Joseph faced in welcoming Mary into his home were on a par with the challenges Mary faced in accepting to be the mother of Jesus. Their obedience set them on a path that filled them with a joy and a suffering that only those who truly love and are faithful can experience and also brought forth a joy and a hope that is universal. The obedience asked for in marriage is not about doing the will of the spouse no matter what but the true response to love; a desire to give of the best and fulfil the deepest desire of the spouse. God's love in giving us Jesus, his son, is a response to our deepest desire to let God live in and through our actions, prayers and life. No wonder that our response is one of great joy and exultation at the trust God has in us to let the light of Christ shine in the world through us. Pope Francis: "The Christmas story invites us to set out on a spiritual journey, drawn by the humility of the God who became man in order to encounter every man and woman. We come to realize that so great is his love for us that he became one of us, so that we in turn might become one with him."
