As in previous years, our volunteers will collect Christmas trees in the following areas:

Simply sign up to our Treecycle, pay a donation to the Hospice (minimum donation £10 per tree), strip your tree of decorations and leave it outside your home in a visible place ready for collection from Saturday 11th January. Our team of volunteers will collect your tree any time between Saturday 11th and Tuesday 14th January.

All trees will be shredded and chippings will be used in playgrounds in schools in our community.

There are limited collection slots available so book your tree collection today to avoid disappointment!

This year is a preparation for the 150th anniversary of the foundation of the Assumptionists. Each week we will look briefly at the life of an Assumptionist whose anniversary of death is that week. Fr Aidan Kenny was parish priest here in Hitchin during the fifties but before that he had founded the Becket School at Nottingham, (1931) which is very strong today. He also, as

parish priest ,restored the war damaged church at Bethnal Green. Fr Aidan is buried in one of our graves in St Johns cemetery.
