**Ramblings** Translated, baptism means being plunged or immersed - not only in water but also in Christ. Baptism makes Christ present within us and around us. We carry that life of Christ wherever we go, whether we acknowledge it or not. For centuries the foremost reason for baptism was being freed from sin and receiving a pass into heaven. Realising that Jesus died to save everybody including the unbaptised, much greater emphasis is now placed on *mission*. Our mission is to reflect the Good News of Jesus Christ in our lives and radiate the joy of the Gospel. However, we quickly recognise that we cannot do this without Christ's help because we become aware of our short-comings and failings. Consequently, we believe we are incapable of attempting to fulfil our mission without God's healing and forgiveness. Forgiveness sets us free from all that holds us back, prevents us from doing the good we want to do, from all that eats away at the joy in our lives or leaves us feeling helpless. The Spirit we have received and the light of Christ in baptism awaken within us a passion and desire to share the goodness and love of Christ we have received. In the sharing, goodness, love, passion, and desire grow stronger. As Pope Francis says: "The mission of the Christian in the world is a mission of service. requiring great generosity and a gaze and heart turned heavenward invoking the Lord's help. There is so much need for Christians who bear witness to the Gospel with joy in everyday life. The disciples, sent by Jesus, 'returned with joy'. When we do this, our heart will also fill with joy."

### Baby in church

We have all heard the baby crying in church when the priest was speaking. Not all, however, have read Father Conroy's book, "A Mill Town Pastor," nor his delightful telling of a similar



experience. "There are two of us preaching in this church at once," said the pastor, "and I don't know which of us is giving the better sermon. When a baby cries in church he is telling two things: First, that there are babies in the family, and second, that the mother has come to Mass with her baby. On the whole, I think the baby is preaching the better sermon and I'll let him get on with it."

We are delighted to welcome children of all ages to our church and do what we can to support their understanding of the liturgy. If children are noisy they will only learn to be quiet if they are brought regularly. So please do bring them and please sit in the front rows where they can see what is going on!



Children's liturgy is offered at the 10.30 Mass for children of school age from Reception to year 5. Children go out at the start of Mass when called by the Priest. Children are split into two

groups. Reception -Year 2 go to the lower committee room. Years 3-5 go to the upper committee room. The 4th Sunday of the month is a children's Mass and everyone remains in the church for a children focused liturgy. Liturgy for the 0-4 years and their parents is offered at the 10.30 Mass and everyone goes out to the hall after the gospel when called by the Priest.

4-5 times per year we have a Sonseeker Sunday when the children have a liturgy in the hall and take part in activities relevant to the liturgy and come into the Mass at communion to receive the Lord or a blessing and to feedback to the parish on their activities. We need more people to join the Sonseeker team and to help run these sessions. The commitment is limited and the satisfaction of helping is immense. Please speak to Trish if you are willing to join the team.



Sacrament of the sick will be offered at the end of all Masses on the weekend of 1 & 2 February for any parishioners who would like the grace from anointing and reassured of God's great love for you.



This week we remember two Assumptionists who worked in England. Most of us knew Fr Paschal Casserly. It was after retirement in France ,where he had spent most of his priesthood teaching maths and working among the young men seeking their vocation, that Fr Paschal came to Hitchin. He was much appreciated by his former pupils and some made the

journey from France to express their appreciation. Fr Martin Carberry died, aged 33, from cancer. He had been a most active young priest at Nottingham. Having had an arm amputated he learned to use a knitting machine to keep himself busy and even tried to play tennis. He was a splendid example of accepting God's will in most difficult circumstances.
