7-14 March - 2nd SUNDAY OF LENT Year A - the gospel according to Matthew

Parish Prayer: Bless this parish, Lord. Let our community reflect your own communion of love. Help us to live peacefully and humbly, attending to the call of your Spirit and mindful of our duty to everything you have created. Strengthen the bonds of our families and friendships with patience and Make us joyful messengers of your kingdom and a source of comfort for those in need. Amen.

Ramblings God's Presence remember that Old Testament figure whose face shone like the sun and had to cover his face? . . . Yes, it was Moses! It happened after his encounter with God on Mount Sinai. Jesus often slipped away to be alone with God and those encounters must have made him glow with God's presence. It was this glow his apostles experienced on mount Tabor. We were given that presence in baptism when we were made temples of God. Like Moses and Jesus, therefore, it is in our encounters with God in prayer that God's presence begins to glow more strongly within. In the desert last week, Jesus discovered the power of God's presence - a power he would use for others. This week Jesus savs that it is how we use our gifts, abilities, and power in the service of others that will show our true fidelity to God. In Lent we chip away at the screen we have built that hides God's presence from us, eager to discover the brightness of that presence. The more aware we are of the divine presence within, the more aware we will be of that presence and brightness of God in others. In reaching out in service to those in any kind of need we will best discover that presence. . . "They glorified God in me." I SAW thee once and nought discerned for stranger to admire; a serious aspect, but it burned with no unearthly fire. Again, I saw, and I confessed Thy speech was rare and high; and yet it vexed my burdened breast, and scared, I knew not why. I saw once more, and awe-struck gazed on face, and form, and air; God's living glory round thee blazed — a Saint — a Saint was there!" [Transfiguration (John Henry

Corona Virus Precautions Update

The pastoral team and parish council have agreed that a proactive stance with regard to the corona virus is the best one to take so with immediate effect the following will happen.

- 1. The holy water has been removed from the stoop.
- There is hand gel on the tables in the porch so please get into the habit of using it as you come in to church. We will try to keep up the supply.
- 3. We have removed the Mass sheets but replaced them with the same sheet which we want you to take home and bring when you come to Mass. Please do not leave them in the church or porch as they will have to be destroyed and we would prefer to minimise the expense. Please do remember to bring them the next time you come to Mass. If you take the sheet of the readings please take that home with you. Do not leave it in the church or put it back in the porch. If you have your own missal this is a good time to bring it to Mass. If you wish to buy a missal you can go to Amazon online and look for CTS New Sunday Missal 2020 (paperback from £6.99) or The **Sunday Missal** (hardcover from £18.99)
- 4. Children's colouring packs will not be put out. We will supply the colouring sheets and bulletins but please bring your own colouring pencils. Please take all sheets you have touched home with you.

- 5. We will not use hymn books but will provide sheets with the hymns on for the 8.30 and 10.30 Masses. These will need to be left in the box provided in the porch and will be disposed of after Mass. If this proves too expensive we will have to reconsider our approach to music in the Mass.
- 6. There will not be an offertory procession at the 10.30 Mass.
- 7. We will not have the handshake of peace.
- 8. We will not be using chalices for the precious Blood and will only have the Body of Christ at communion. Please receive this on your hand not on your tongue.
