Area of Activity Report on Ecumenism for Parish Council Jan 2020 – Mike Edwards

Some recent activities of the CTH as follows

- Faith and Learning 11 Lent groups met in a 5 week course entitled 'At the Cross' by Abby Guinness. Good Friday Walk of Witness was well attended Donald Smith, Chair of CTH, led the service, Jane Robson preached, the Zeo Church provided the music and we provided the Hot Cross Buns!
- Mission and Outreach the Food Rescue Hub and Feed Up Warm Up are both working well
- Local Community more than 350 people receive support from the Foodbank each month.
 We supported the collection of items for the Christmas Hampers organised by the Zeo Church. Hitchin Street Angels continue to do their work on Sat nights helping youngsters in town. Recycling is going on apace at Our Lady's.
- Justice and Peace Efforts are being made to educate our local PM about our CTH supported activities by inviting him to visit the Foodbank, the Sanctuary and Feed Up Warm Up etc.
- Christian Aid Last year this raised £13,618 but this has been going down in recent years so
 it has been decided not to do it next time. Instead it has been suggested told that several
 churches could Big Brekkes to raise money.
- Publicity a worthwhile meeting of church newsletter editors has been held on 16th Nov.
 Partly because of Publicity several Churches not in the CTH are considering joining.
- CTH Website this area is developing well. Particular attention is being paid to GDPR and the safety of passwords.
- Twitter this developing rapidly. PHASE has currently 1153 followers and the new minister at St Mary's Rev Chris Bunce has already 271!
- Prayer Link this is developing quite well so people can share concerns, prayers etc and is produced 4 times a year.
- PHASE over 150 children attended a one day holiday club Time Trek. Two new programs have been started Let's Talk Emotions and a Self- Esteem group.
- Interfaith Forum the local Buddhist community have become involved. Collaborative projects such as the Peace Garden in the Quaker Meeting House
- Christians against poverty/Job Club this has been working well for the past 4 years and has helped over 100 people. At least 2 or 3 people have found work after attending each 8 week course.
- Ministers' Meetings the ministers have these occasions a great source of food, conversation, and laughter and a good deal of planning and reflecting also takes place. They are able to consider such substantial topics as gender identity and the climate emergency. They were considerably saddened by the death of Father Michael but knew that he would have been greatly supportive of them continuing their good work and fellowship.

Activity since last PPC meeting

Diocese Annual Report & Account 2018.

Fr Tom attended a briefing on the Annual Report & Accounts of the Diocese at Westminster on Saturday 2 Nov 19. The Accounts showed a slight improvement in the financial position of the Diocese but the Report reflected on-going concern at the reduction in income and the nature and extent of External Audit observations.

Parish Accounts for 2019

The Parish Accounts through to the end of November 2019 show an operating surplus of just over £23,500 thanks to receipt of the Gift Aid Tax Rebate and the proceeds of the Michaelmas Fair and with payments and other outgoings due.

Parish Budget 2020

The Parish Budget for 2020 predicts an operating deficit in excess of £4,000.

Michaelmas Fair 2019

This year's Michaelmas Fair raised just short of £6,500; a donation of £2,500 has been made from the proceeds to Diapalante, the selected OWG charity, and distribution of the Parish share is still to be determined.

Growing In Faith

Details are still awaited of the contribution of the Parish to the Diocese Growing In Faith Appeal,

which has now been completed.

Second Collections

There was little support for the proposal to reduce the number of Second Collections and we have decided, therefore, to continue "as we were" but limit the number of Second Collections to no more than two per month and to provide a fuller explanation of the purpose of each Second Collection in the Newsletter and Notices.

Hall Hire Agreement

We have been working with Trish and John (Chamberlain) to strengthen the wording in the Hall Hire Agreement pertaining to the safeguarding and fire-safety responsibilities of users,

Maintenance

Special thanks to John (Scott) for his work in inspecting and clearing out all the gutters and downpipes without which the Parish insurance cover would be invalid.

Poor & Needy Donations

Where we can, we are now making poor and needy grants using food vouchers rather than cash.

Parish Projects

The Finance Committee has continued to support and provide advice on the Parish Projects that are in planning or in progress including securing funding for the appointment of a Youth Worker (see Youth Ministry Report).

An anonymous donation of £37,000 has been received towards the cost of the Replacement Scout Hut.
