Ramblings Doubt leading to Faith

The many miracles and signs worked through the apostles made a deep impression on everyone, we read in Acts. Miracles continue to happen today in abundance. The now famous Captain Tom Moore raised over £22 million for the NHS from a short walk. A man who had lost his job and unable to pay for a funeral led to a collection of £100,000. There are hundreds of thousands of people keeping an eye on an elderly neighbour or person in need. The NHS is saving people's lives every day. Christ is truly alive! There is no lack of miracle today. So, I ask you to hold Thomas the apostle in high esteem this week. He had the courage to voice what others only thought but kept guiet. They did not believe the women who told them Christ was risen. Peter and John had to run to the tomb to verify what the women told them. Even when Jesus appeared to the disciples, at first, they could not believe their eyes. Jesus had to appear several times before they were convinced. To doubt and to question, in the case of Thomas, led him to declare a much greater conviction of his Faith than the others were willing to openly admit. Remember that Mary asked the angel "How can this be?" Then she responded in a similar way to Thomas by opening herself fully to God which is what Thomas does in proclaiming "My Lord and my God!" As with all miracles, proclamation of faith leads to action. Mary brought forth Christ into the world, nurturing and supporting him throughout. Thomas took the Good News of Jesus Christ to India where he nurtured and strengthened the faith of the new Christians there. You all have faith. Don't fail to see the miracles taking place in your homes and round about. Christ is truly risen and his miracles happening today are proof of it. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

St George (- c.303)



He was martyred at Lydda (now in Israel) in about 303, during the persecution Diocletian. Like so many saints of that period, the only fact that we can be certain of is his martyrdom. His cult spread quickly through both the East and the West, and the legend

of St George and the Dragon only appeared some time afterwards.

During the crusades, George was seen to personify the ideals of Christian chivalry, and he was adopted as the patron saint of several city states and countries, including England and Catalonia. King Richard I of England placed his crusading army under the protection of St George, and in 1222 his feast was proclaimed a holiday.

Also, can we take this opportunity to remind you that a Gift Aid donation must be made in the name of the person who pays the tax on the money that is donated; if that is not the case, please let David know and alternative arrangements can be made. Last but not least, can we again say a big "thank to all of you who have signed Gift Aid Declarations in favour of the Church as the tax rebate plays such an important part in financing the running of the Church – thank you.

Fly Tipping

Fly Tips should be reported to your local district council. The link <u>www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/flytipping</u> provides various ways you can report fly tipping in your local district, including online reporting, email and telephone numbers.

Skips are still in operation and this is a secure way of depositing waste. An invoice from the skip company fulfils the obligation for a householder's duty of care. Please check with the skip company as some are happy to drop the skip but it could take two to three weeks to collect.
