Ramblings The gate to the sheepfold

Gates. doors. entrances are invitations something greater. The best gateways and most interesting doors are those that invite us to pass into the unknown with an expectation of mystery and adventure. Jesus, the gateway, speaks of security and protection for whatever we may encounter on the other side. And the promise written over his gate is life to the full. This is what those early converts to Jesus Christ both wanted and experienced. Despite the warning about suffering, even rejection, we would feel cheated if did not experience some challenge. Otherwise, it would all seem too easy. Although pain and suffering can be signs of something physically wrong, they can also be signs of healing. We exercise a painful limb to get it back into working order. Pain inspires patience, strengthens character, and improves courage. The athlete's mantra is - Pain is Gain!! Through his suffering and death, Jesus won life for us and brought us healing. In following Jesus, the Way, we can be instruments of healing through the sufferings we encounter along the way. This is not and never should glorify suffering but offers us an opportunity to give suffering a positive and healing purpose. Jesus has showed us that love and suffering go hand in hand. We suffer whenever those we love suffer from any physical or spiritual setback or failure. In fact, suffering could be seen as the measure of our love for someone; most especially when a loved one dies. In this Easter season, Jesus reminds us that his love for us is so great that he will always be very, very close to us but that in suffering, Jesus will be even closer.

#### **SPECIAL NEWS ITEM**

from parishioners to parishioners

In these extraordinary times we now find ourselves living in, it is uplifting to be able to share some incredibly happy information with you.

The teachers who were dismissed for gross misconduct from our parish school, Our Lady Catholic Primary School in January 2018, took their cases to the Employment Tribunal and have won their cases for Unfair and Constructive Dismissals.

This follows on from the announcement in summer 2019 that the eleven former teachers at the school, who had been referred to the Teaching Regulation Agency (TRA) by the Diocese of Westminster Academy Trust, had all been cleared and that the TRA had closed all cases with no allegations being served.

In both 2006 and 2009, the school was graded Outstanding by Ofsted and the Diocese. The 2014 Inspection on RE by the Diocese of Westminster Academy Trust also graded it Outstanding in every area.

After almost two and half extremely difficult years the Judgment this week is great news for the former stakeholders and pupils of Our Lady Catholic School, as well as our Hitchin parish and wider community. A heartfelt 'thank you' to the parents, pupils and parishioners, who have not wavered in their belief and given such love and support.

#### Other items of interest

The NHS partners have provided information about how to access Hertfordshire's three pop-up **COVID-19 drive-through test centres** this Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

The pop-up sites in Hertford (Saturdays), Watford (Sundays) and Stevenage (Mondays) have been commissioned by local NHS organisations and are supported by the military. Testing at each site will open at 10am and run until 4pm.

Information about the test criteria, together with an explanation of what to do if you meet the criteria for a test is included in the document which can be found on the parish website.
