## Colette, Westminster Justice and Peace Co-ordinator, writes:

One of the most powerful experiences for me in the last couple of months was attending the first Black Lives Matter rally in Trafalgar Square, following the death of George Floyd, and joining the emotional yet peaceful witness of hundreds of people, mostly young adults from many different ethnic backgrounds, chanting 'I can't breathe,' 'Say their names,' and taking a knee together.

Racial justice has been an important theme for the Justice & Peace movement for many decades and yet black people in our Church and society are telling us that we are still a very long way from removing the scourge of racism. Some of its more overt features may be weakening, but structural conditioning and expectations, based on perceptions of skin colour, remain deeply ingrained, despite the individual successes of many more men and women from BAME backgrounds. The nastier elements of the twin legacies of African enslavement and imperial colonialism extend long reach into the current century and are proving difficult to eradicate.

However, the murder of one man, in one country, by one officer of the law, captured on camera by one teenager, may have marked a turning point from which there is no going back. The Diocesan Communications Department has produced a video testimony from four black Catholics, alongside the Cardinal, that all are invited to watch, which we hope will open up an on-going conversation, beginning with our webinar 'A Catholic Response to George Floyd and Black Lives Matter' on Friday 24th July at 7.30pm.
