Ramblings It seems that the parable of the tares (the weeds) addressed a common cultural theme of the day: revenge. An enemy would seek revenge for something done in the past. The tit for tat then continued throughout history. Rather than seek revenge, however, landowner in the parable allows the weeds to grow up with the wheat since they looked very similar to each other in early growth. At first the landowner would appear to be shamed at the harvest but he ends up not only with his wheat crop but also with fuel for his furnace. He is much better off for not seeking vengeance. Isn't that a lesson for us all?? The farmers would have understood the lesson of the story. In the explanation provided, the story is applied to the Christian community which had both good and bad members within it. Jesus does not want us to root out the bad members believing that, if we lived our lives faithfully, we might even convert them. Those who believe God would never condemn people to an eternal fire have a point because evil people choose to live in an eternal state of bitterness, hatred and fear - a life lacking in goodness. Living in heaven would be hell for them. Evil isolates, creates fear, promotes cruelty abuse. makes friendship impossible, imposes a life of suffering while pretending to offer the fulfilment of a person's deepest desires. Compare this with kindness, gentleness, caring, empathy, compassion, temperance, forgiveness and inexplicable joy and happiness. The latter are far, far easier to live than the former. Or, do you disagree???


foodbank
