1st August – 8th August 2020 - 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year A – the gospel according to Matthew

Parish Prayer: Lord Jesus, as the world copes with coronavirus, help us to remember that you are always with us. Grant wisdom to decision makers and bless all health workers. Bring healing to the sick; give peace to the anxious and comfort those who are sad. Stir us to show your love and mercy most especially to the poor and weak. This we ask in your name. Amen.

Ramblings We are used to number lines, quantities and statistics which we usually analyse wrongly. In scripture Numbers are symbolic. Number 5 was a symbol of God's grace, goodness and favour, and mentioned 318 times; while the number 2 conveyed the notion of a union. Number 12 was considered to be a perfect number, symbolising God's power and authority, as well as serving as a perfect governmental foundation. It can also symbolize completeness or the nation of Israel as a whole - the twelve symbolizes tribes. The number 1.000 "immensity," "fullness of quantity" "multitude" so 5,000 stood for a very large number of people. Too often we want to explain parables and develop an understanding that is conclusive. In fact, parables are power-houses of wisdom and insight that speak of the wonder and presence of God, of God's relationship with us and our relationship with God. One of the riches of the feeding of the 5,000 is to help us see that meals together are special places in which God is particularly present, hoping to feed our hearts, our minds and our souls with his love which is present in abundance. It stresses the importance of being together and of sharing what is happening in our lives, sharing stories and discoveries, stimulating and strengthening friendship. All this is part of the treasure that is the kingdom of heaven.

Hilaire Belloc: Ultimately the reason we should rejoice in the love of laughter as we rejoice in the love of friends is that laughter, like love, is a gift of God... From quiet homes and first beginnings, out to the undiscovered ends, there's nothing worth the wear of winning than laughter and the love for friends... Wherever the Catholic sun doth shine, there's always laughter and good red wine.
