


# CHURCH OF OUR LADY IMMACULATE AND ST ANDREW

Ramblings STORY: There were two youngsters who were always getting into trouble for taking things. Their mother decided to send them to the priest. The first brother went in and the elderly priest stood there, rather awesome and overpowering. He looked at the boy and said rather sternly, "Where is God? Where is God?" The boy looked startled, stood up and ran out of the room to his brother and said. "We're in real trouble now. They have lost God and they think we are the ones who stole him!!!!!" So, where is God? The simple answer is everywhere but we want and need something much more concrete and tangible. The answer to where God is cannot be found in the head or in some theological definition because it is in an experience. Elijah experienced Wind, Fire and Earthquake but he only experienced God in the gentle breeze. That's our challenge this week: to experience God in different ways not just in our head but in our hearts and souls. God in the simple and ordinary encounters in life, in flora and fauna but most especially in those who are closest to us. The pandemic has provided us with plenty of opportunities to discover God in our families. It is in these simple but profound experiences, all unique in their own way, that, when we gather them all together, they help us build up a mosaic of God; a mosaic that is ever changing and evolving into something more beautiful and wonderful as we add the new encounters and experiences we have each day. Where is God? Closer than you think!

Face Coverings Face coverings will be mandatory in Places of Worship from this Saturday 8th August 2020.

All those who are attending churches must wear a face covering unless they are exempt from

This is for the good of all who gather in the Church for Mass as it is an enclosed public space where there are people from differing households who they do not normally meet.

Priests in the sanctuary providing they are sufficiently distant (2m or more) from the congregation do not need to wear a face covering except when distributing Holy Communion. Other ministers in the sanctuary should wear face coverings and remain socially distant from the celebrant.

Readers may remove their face coverings at the lectern to read and should replace them before stepping away from it providing the lectern is sufficiently distant from the congregation.

When you are receiving communion you should unloop your face covering and consume the Sacred Host and then replace the face covering.

Fr Euloge gave a really interesting reflection this week on the use of a facemask and has been wearing one permanently since then.
