Parish Prayer: Lord Jesus, as the world copes with coronavirus, help us to remember that you are always with us. Grant wisdom to decision makers and bless all health workers. Bring healing to the sick; give peace to the anxious and comfort those who are sad. Stir us to show your love and mercy most especially to the poor and weak. This we ask in your name. Amen.

Ramblings Have you ever thought about the different uses of Keys? Obviously, they are used for opening and closing doors. The keys of the door to your house are given to you as a sign that you have reached the age of responsibility. They are very often a sign of authority. They provide entrance to special buildings, access to certain prohibited areas. In the case of Saint Peter, they were the sign of his ultimate office as a leader of the first Christian community that became known as the Church. Keys are also used to keep things safe, for protection. Keys, then, are sign of authority and power both small and great. Jesus told Peter that he had the authority to bind and to loose; not for himself but for the Church, for people. Jesus used his authority and power to help people, to set them free from past errors, however bad, and liberate them from all that pulled them away from God. The power of binding was about binding the evil in such a way that it could not lead people astray or into any kind of wrong-doing that would cause them harm. Pope Francis referring to this passage said: "Power to bind and unravel' refers to the power to set people free from sin, make proclamations of faith and take disciplinary action in the Church. It is through the ministry of the apostles, and especially the ministry of Peter, that Jesus has entrusted this authority to the church." While Thich Nhat Hanh reminds us that: "everything we touch in our daily lives, including our body, is a miracle. By putting the Kingdom of God in the right place, it shows us that it is possible to live happily right here, right now." As the hymn proclaims: How lovely on the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news. Announcing peace, proclaiming news of happiness, our God reigns; our God reigns!
