Parish Prayer: Lord Jesus, as the world copes with coronavirus, help us to remember that you are always with us. Grant wisdom to decision makers and bless all health workers. Bring healing to the sick; give peace to the anxious and comfort those who are sad. Stir us to show your love and mercy most especially to the poor and weak. This we ask in your name. Amen.

Ramblings St Paul writes that, "Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments." Isn't interesting that when all else fails and a person does not turn from evil ways, Jesus says treat him like a pagan or a tax collector. Jesus bent over backwards to help pagans and tax collectors, completely opposite to the social norm. We are being encouraged to do everything we can in order to bring people back to the right path, to open them to God's love and forgiveness. True love has no bounds. Ronald Rolheiser writing about Greek mythology says that Aphrodite, the goddess of Love, was born out of the sea; but, as she rises above the waves in her stunning beauty, her nakedness is shielded by three deities: Aidos, the goddess of modesty and respect ; Eros, the god of love; and Horai, the goddess of propriety. They protect her naked body with love, propriety, and modesty. For the ancient Greeks, this was a religious truth, one which taught that without these three protecting deities, the naked body should not be seen. When nakedness (of any kind) is not protected by these deities, it is unfairly exposed and dishonoured. Modesty, love and propriety is what we seek to use to shield the person who strays into evil ways. This is why Jesus came and accepted the shame, the hatred and the impropriety of the cross so that we would not have to. Remember the words of St Augustine from last week. What does love look like? It has the hands to help others. It has the feet to hasten to the poor and needy. It has eyes to see misery and want. It has the ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of men. Love of neighbour means treating them with modesty, respect, love and propriety.

The Foodbank and Feedup Warm Up have been continuing to feed people over the time of the pandemic. FUWU have been feeding up to 60 people each week. They had taken over the parish hall to store all the food that is donated, including fresh food from a range of local businesses and for a while were in most days preparing meals and food parcels. They are now consolidating their work to Wednesday afternoon and evening and all day Thursdays. This week the hall is having its ceiling replaced to a fully insulated ceiling with new lighting which will help energy and heat conservation for the parish. You will have seen the pictures in the past of the vast amount of food being stored in the hall and Liz Wills and her team moved all this into the Scout hall this weekend so the parish hall is clear for the works. This means we now have the Foodbank and FUWU doing their vital work to feed the hungry and needy and help the homeless in our community, under the same roof once again. Our parish prayer during a pandemic includes 'Stir us to show your love and mercy most especially to the poor and weak.' In the work of the Foodbank and Feed Up Warm Up we are seeing that in action. Thanks go to Liz and Charmaine and their teams for the wonderful work they do.
