**Pope Francis:** To love God and neighbour is not something abstract, but profoundly concrete: it means seeing in every person and face of the Lord to be served, to serve him concretely. And you are, dear brothers and sisters, in the face of Jesus.

Love lets us reach God: "Through our love for our neighbour we can get to know God, who is love. Only through loving can we reach love."

"He who loves knows God; he who does not love has no knowledge of God because God is love. It is not the love of a 'soap opera.' No, it is solid, strong and eternal. It 'manifests' itself in the Son, in the Son of God who has come to save us. It is a concrete love made of works and not of words. To know God, we must walk through life in love, love for our neighbour, love for those who hate us. love for all."

Mary Blaksley helped establish Garden House Hospice Care 30 years ago and has been an ambassador and volunteer ever since.

Trying her hand at a variety of voluntary roles at trading, the kitchen, beverage room, laundry, flower room and more recently the warm and welcoming face on our hospice reception, Mary has been a passionate and present pillar of the organisation.

Mary introduced Sir Nigel Hawthorn, the former president of the Hospice and says her highlight of the last three decades was being part of the committee for the grand Royal Gala at the Gordon Craig theatre in 1989 with guest of honour HRH Prince Edward, which raised £35.000.

When asked why she has supported the Hospice for 30 years, Mary said, "The people that I've met here over the years have been incredible.

Volunteering makes a difference when it matters most to local people in need. I will miss coming in and hope to come back again soon to visit.

The Hospice is a community in itself, we've all supported each other through good and bad times and I can't imagine a life without it."

What message would you give to people who are thinking about volunteering?

"Come and enjoy yourself with all the other people who volunteer and work here. I think quite honestly, the people I have met here are incredible and the fact that you're doing something for people that need you is such a wonderful feeling"

In August the Hospice welcomed Mary to be presented with gifts including a badge for distinguished volunteers. Sue Plummer, Hospice CEO said, "Mary's dedication and contribution have been inspiring for many of us here at the Hospice, a role-model for staff and volunteers both past and present.

Her remarkable role in the creation of the organisation and the positive impact it has had on the community of North Hertfordshire in the time since is outstanding"

At 89 years old, Mary is still busy spreading the word of the Hospice with everyone she speaks to. It's safe to say that all at the Hospice will miss her greatly, but this isn't goodbye, they will keep in regular contact and hope to welcome her back to the Hospice in the future.



This week we remember Mgr Pie Neveu. He worked in Eastern Europe teaching at our school at Varna and then in Russia. He was ordained bishop secretly and was responsible for the catholics in Moscow and around. Eventually having returned to France he was refused a return visa to Russia and worked in various dioceses in France until his death in 1946.
