Over the past few years a much loved parishioner, Mary Deuchar, asked parishioners for their stories about the theme chosen for Advent and also if they would read them during our Advent service.

Mary died in August and it is important, for those of us who knew her and loved her, to continue her legacy for Advent and Lent. It is thanks to Mary that you receive daily reflections by email. It was her suggestion that we start doing it two years ago after the untimely death of Fr Michael and it will carry on until we see an end to the current pandemic.

**Please, please help make this service special in this highly unusual time in our history.**

Advent is a time of waiting, longing and hoping. We long for community and connection with others. We long for an end to the current pandemic. We wait and watch with eager expectation.

Advent is a time when God searches for us just as we search for God. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent, St Paul calls us to *'Be happy at all times; to pray constantly; and, for all things, to give thanks to God, because this is what God expects*

*you to do in Christ Jesus' (1 Tessaionians 5:16)*

With these words in mind, I ask for your help.
