Ramblings There are many parallels between this story of Abraham offering his son in sacrifice and the Father offering his Son, Jesus, in sacrifice. Jesus, like Isaac, carried the wood to his place of offering, calvary. Isaac, however, was not put to death. The story also showed that the God of Abraham did not want child-sacrifice as found in some pagan religions. Yet, the main lesson of the story was Abraham's obedience to God, in contrast to Adam's disobedience. For a moment put yourself in Abraham's sandals (no shoes then). What was going through Abraham's mind as he led his son to the altar. His future would effectively die with Isaac. He must have questioned who this God was who asked him to do such a thing. Had everything up to then been a bad, bad mistake? With heavy heart and even heavier hand, he prepared to sacrifice Isaac when the angel of God stopped him. Stop! Your God does not want this. The relief that filled Abraham would have been evident and his heart imbued with unspeakable joy. Abraham then understood his God to be a merciful and loving God; his image of God truly transformed. The transfiguration would have been so much more than words for the Apostles, despite the attempt to do so by the gospel writers.

For that one moment, 'in and out of time', on that one mountain where all moments meet, the daily veil that covers the sublime in darkling glass fell dazzled at his feet.

There were no angels full of eyes and wings, just living glory full of truth and grace.

The Love that dances at the heart of things shone out upon us from a human face.

And to that light the light in us leaped up, we felt it quicken somewhere deep within, a sudden blaze of long-extinguished hope trembled and tingled through the tender skin.

Nor can this blackened sky, this darkened scar eclipse that glimpse of how things really are.
