COVID vaccinations

If you are aged 56 + and haven't had your first COVID vaccine, you can book an appointment via the [national booking service](#) or by calling 119 (between 7am and 11pm, Monday - Sunday). If you would like to get your vaccination at your GP hub, rather than at a site on the national booking system, wait for your GP to contact you.

Over 414,930 people in Hertfordshire & west Essex have received their first dose of the vaccine. Across England, over 18 million people have received the vaccination (one third of the adult population).

Lateral flow testing – schools

Children returned to schools on 8 March. Secondary school students are being tested 3 times a week in the first two weeks of school, before being provided with two tests per week to use at home. Parents and carers are being encouraged to get two rapid tests a week. Regular testing should help reduce the spread of the virus in the community and protect vulnerable people.

Rapid COVID Testing for Hertfordshire Key Workers

Anyone without coronavirus symptoms can now get a rapid test. Anyone who cannot work from home is encouraged to book a test every few days.
