

Holy Week information Following advice from the Bishops we are now putting together our liturgies for Holy

Week. As a result of the continuing restrictions in order to expedite the liturgy in a dignified way and to keep the services as short as possible there are quite a few changes. We are planning to have two Masses on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday at 10am and 12pm (as long as we can get all the volunteers we need to have in place) and we will have the Mass of the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, the Good Friday service and the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening. Ramblings Laetare Sunday is also known as Rose Mothering Sunday. Historically, servants were released from service for the day to visit their mothers. hence the term "Mothering Sunday." Our readings offer much over which to rejoice. Cyrus, the ruler of the day, frees the Israelites from their exile allowing them to return home and rebuild their lives, their identity and, above all, their Temple. He gives them the opportunity to restore God at the centre of their lives. We have just passed the mid-point of our Lenten journey, strengthening our hopes and expectations for the coming Easter feast, which we will be able to celebrate together. Jesus makes it clear that it was out of great love that God sent him to us; to be our light, to inspire our love and our hope, and to strengthen our faith. As we thank God for our mothers today, we also thank God for sending us Jesus and for all that he has done most especially through our mothers. In his recent encyclical Fratelli Tutti Pope Francis speaks of the freedom and joy of our faith. James Hanvey SJ, puts it like this: Francis reminds us that faith is a source of life and joy and possibility for the whole of our lives; it calls us to a new level of relationality and opens our hearts and our minds to the depth of all that is. Faith, then, does not limit the horizons of our knowing or living or freedom, but expands them. It not only bestows upon us a responsibility for the world in which we live and create - the world who is my neighbour - but it gives us joy in the work of serving this world and all the life that it contains. There is a joy in Christian life, which comes from knowing that we participate in the restoration and sanctification of the world which Christ has redeemed. Can there really be any greater honour or purpose or meaning than this? Knowing this, we can truly rejoice!!


