Jeremiah had the most difficult life as a prophet, constantly facing adversity, rejection and hostility from all sides. Yet, throughout his life and despite the loneliness and despair he faced, he continued to trust in God. Such strength of faith! Jesus must have found strength in reading Jeremiah in the loneliness and abandonment that he experienced as reflected in the Gospel.
