

Reflection Saturday Lent 5 – 2021

Ephraim was the second son of Joseph, the youngest son of Jacob (Israel). Ephraim means *'being fruitful'*. Jesus took refuge in Ephraim and he was certainly *fruitful!*

How often do our predictions come back to haunt us? The excuse given for killing Jesus was that, if he became too popular, the Romans would destroy Jerusalem. In fact, it was the priests and leaders who initiated the future fall of Jerusalem. As Ezekiel says, Jesus came to unite people - not just the Jewish people but all people - in a way in which each person was treated with equal respect, dignity and honour. We now enter a time of waiting. Waiting to see what will happen just as the people in Jerusalem wondered whether Jesus would come to the festival. The danger is that knowing the story so well we will fail to receive the new message this year because the story is the same. The pandemic, the continued uncertainty, the questions about the future and how we will adjust our lives, all change the setting of the story. A significant lesson is that we are being led into an experience of what is happening to creation. Its future is far from certain. At present it appears limited and open to more and more suffering. We need the promised healing and new life of Jesus not just for ourselves and the people of the world but for our creation which is calling out in one great cry of travail.
