Ramblings



Celebrating the triduum last year was close to heart-breaking without the presence of the parish family. It was like trying to clap with one hand and celebrating something on one's own. And yet, the celebration offered the comforting promise of New Life and Hope in the future without any indication of when that would be. A year has passed - a year in a wilderness that was extremely difficult for many. The promised light this year, however, is so much brighter. It reassures us that resurrection has dawned, albeit more slowly than on that first resurrection. It comes with all the promise, exultation and heartfelt joy of the first. John O Donohoe aptly describes the resurrection promise as follows:

The promise to each of us is that we will never be called to walk the lonely path of suffering without seeing the footprints ahead of us which lead eventually over the brow of the hill where Resurrection awaits us. Behind the darkness of suffering, a subtle brightening often manifests itself. Lines from a poem by Philippe Jaccottet echo this: "Love, like fire, can only reveal its brightness on the failure and the beauty of burnt wood." There is consolation and transfiguration here. The fires of suffering are disclosures of love. It is the nature of the lover to suffer. The marks and wounds that suffering leave on us are eventually places of beauty. This is the deep beauty of soul where limitation and damage, rather than remaining forces that cripple, are revealed as transfiguration. John O'Donohoe

May the Resurrection reveal the staggering beauty that you are!


