

Ramblings Despite being offered peace by Jesus, the disciples were startled and frightened. It took them some time to became open to the peace being offered. Once they did, joy took over and they were ready and open to the wisdom Jesus offered them. Only when truly free from fear will we be open to the wisdom and presence of God, of Jesus Christ. Having opened their minds, Jesus sends them out as witnesses. The Acts of the Apostles gives various accounts of the experiences these witnesses faced, many of whom eventually lost their lives. The great blessing, the great grace of these witnesses was that they had lived with and shared in Jesus' life over a lengthy period of time. Fortunately, they had very good memories. We only have brief summaries of what they said. We do not hear what they said about their own experiences of Jesus, how they felt in his presence, the wonder, challenges, insights, difficulties, or their failures to understand. This would have added great value to whatever they said about Jesus' teaching and miracles. They spoke from the heart. Ultimately belief in Christ will lead to a sense of Christ's presence in others, in life experiences, in nature and in oneself. With the heart in the right place, Jesus will open the mind to the understanding and knowledge needed to be his witness!

A young man, training to be an Olympic diver, was raised an atheist. His only religious influence came from his outspoken Christian friend. The diver paid little attention to his friend's sermons but heard them often. One night the diver went to his college pool. Although the lights were off, the pool had large skylights and the moon provided enough light to practice. 

Priest Training Fund Next Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday, the day pray for priests and for vocations to the priesthood. The annual collection for the Priest Training Fund will take place next



weekend. This fund pays for the priestly formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 42 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 18 of whom are for our own Diocese. and two men are studying in Rome, also for our Diocese. Last year two men who studied at Allen Hall and one who studied in Rome ordained to the priesthood to serve as our future priests.
